Meet Heather Galler, a modern-day artist who fills the world with colour, pattern, and joy! Heather is a contemporary American folk artist, which means she creates art that's full of personality, culture, and imagination—without needing to follow strict art rules. Heather's paintings

are bursting with bright colours, bold black outlines, and fun patterns like zigzags, stripes, dots, and swirls. She paints things that are important to her, like animals, flowers, people, and places. Her art is full of energy and happiness, and every painting tells a little story about her life, her family, or the world around her.

What Makes Her Art Special?

She uses lots of patterns to decorate her pictures—sometimes every part of the painting has a different design! Her colours are super bright—you might see pink trees, blue cats, or rainbow houses! She outlines everything in thick black lines, which makes her pictures bold and easy to recognise.

Heather Galler has been painting for over 20 years, creating colourful and joyful artwork that has captured the hearts of many. She often paints pets—especially dogs—and even creates special portraits for people who want to celebrate their furry friends. Her cityscapes are inspired by places she has visited, including New York City, where she lives and works. Heather's artwork is so popular that it has been featured on postage stamps, mugs, and even furniture! She believes that everyone can be an artist if they paint what they love, and she hopes her work inspires others to be creative and express themselves.
